**Accessibility Day to be celebrated
at [Target Field](#) on Sunday, May 15**

Event highlights accessibility of Twins ball park to people with disabilities; accessible seating sponsor [UCare](#) celebrates observance with [Courage Center](#)

DETAILS:

- [UCare](#) sponsors more than 700 accessible seats throughout the year that are featured at Target Field. The Twins use Accessibility Day to highlight the stadium's disability accommodations in all aspects of the ball park experience: drop-off locations, assisted living devices, concessions, first aid/medical care, emergency evacuations, elevators and escalators, gate opening times, and more. - A Courage Center client will throw out the ceremonial first pitch to start the game at 1:10 p.m.
- UCare and Courage Center representatives will kick off the 7th inning stretch by leading Twins fans in singing "Take Me Out to the Ballgame."
- UCare will hand out free bandanas and cloth tote bags to the first 1,000 visitors to its event kiosk, located behind home plate.
